Current students are encouraged to submit their poetry here. The winning words will be published in *Qua*.

Unsure of your words? Dr. Blumner suggests taking them to the <u>Writing Center</u> for some feedback. Pro tip: give yourself time for revision. Professor Larsen says they are looking for poems that make him and Dr. Blumner "want to re-read them, out loud, and find something new."

The two professors started the contest to give everyone on campus a creative outlet, regardless of their major. Professor Larsen knows that UM-Flint students still write creatively, even if they are not currently enrolled in a creative writing class. This contest offers a chance to exhibit those writing skills.

While the prize money is great, the publishing credit is beneficial too; it can help you stand out if you submit to publications in the future. At the very least, it's an interesting talking point on your résumé.

## **Date with an Author: Connor Coyne**

On Valentine's Day, local author Connor Coyne ran "Date with an Author," a two-hour writing workshop, Q&A, and book signing. This event was held at the Marian E. Wright Writing Center and was co-hosted by the Writers' Circle and the Thompson Library.

Student, staff, and faculty attendees participated in several 5-minute writing prompts led by Connor with a focus on different types of relationships. The idea was that depending on the relationship between two people-romantic, familial, or even strangers—the scene they would write and its nuances would be different. The participants were encouraged to share their work as well as their insights on how each prompt manifested for them in terms of setting, characterization, and ease of conceptualization.

After a short break, Connor read an excerpt from his newest work, *Hollywood*. The novella is described by Connor as a "magical realism/cosmic horror queer romance." You can learn more about Connor, *Hollywood*, and his other works by visiting his website.

The Q&A and book signing was opened shortly after, and Connor answered questions regarding his writing and publishing processes, inspirations, previous works, and more.
